Spotlight:

Lambda Chapter Member Spotlight: Marilyn Moorhead



In 1978, Marilyn Moorhead joined Delta Kappa Gamma International because "I was asked." Historically, being asked was and still is a privilege for exceptional teachers. Marilyn admits initially not knowing much about DKG, but now after 33 years of teaching and a busy retirement volunteer schedule. "I enjoy meeting like-minded people, the programs, and," she laughs, "I like to eat" However, the mission of DKG is important to her even in retirement "It's a way to keep up with the things going on in education, and we have the scholarships ... our dues go to do good, to good projects."

Marilyn, originally from Fostoria, started teaching in 1964. After 19 years teaching first grade, 10 years teaching second grade (her favorite), and four years teaching fourth grade, Marilyn has her favorite grade level – second. "It's a good age. They're becoming independent." And in second grade, they are just starting to learn cursive writing.

Cursive writing is "one of those [debates] going on in education" of late. In fact, the Ohio Statehouse in March introduced a bill requiring cursive writing in the curriculum with mastery by fifth grade. Should cursive writing be part of the curriculum? "Absolutely," Marilyn proclaims, explaining the challenges with reading historical text and more if one does not know cursive writing. "It's part of being educated."

Does that go for technology in the classroom? Although that was not really part of Marilyn's experience, except for a basic computer lab once a week in later years, Marilyn reminds us "everything's 'a magic bullet' but it never is." She adds she notices the problems it causes between kids and parents: "It cuts you off from people, a lot don't talk to each other. There should be a balance."

Aside from her participation in DKG, serving currently as Parliamentarian, Marilyn, who has played piano since childhood, fills in as pianist at St. Paul United Methodst Church, ushers for the Renaissance Theatre in Mansfield, delivers Meals on Wheels and plays in the Mansfield Area Dulcimer Group.
